Follow the instructions in the four different stops marked on the map. The stops will help you:

- 1) Decide which drivers of change will be of highest priority over the next decade
- 2) Reflect on the current mental models that underpin our thinking and our work
- 3) Build your future world
- 4) Envision the type of humanitarian organisation that would flourish in this future, and how we get there

Your first mission is to prioritise two (up to three) drivers of change in your future world that are the highest priority. Pick the themes out of the nine on your table. These represent the core of your world. Choose your topics wisely because they will influence decisions in later stages. Once chosen, place them on spaces below.

Choose one you are CERTAIN about how it will play out and one you are UNCERTAIN about how it will play out.

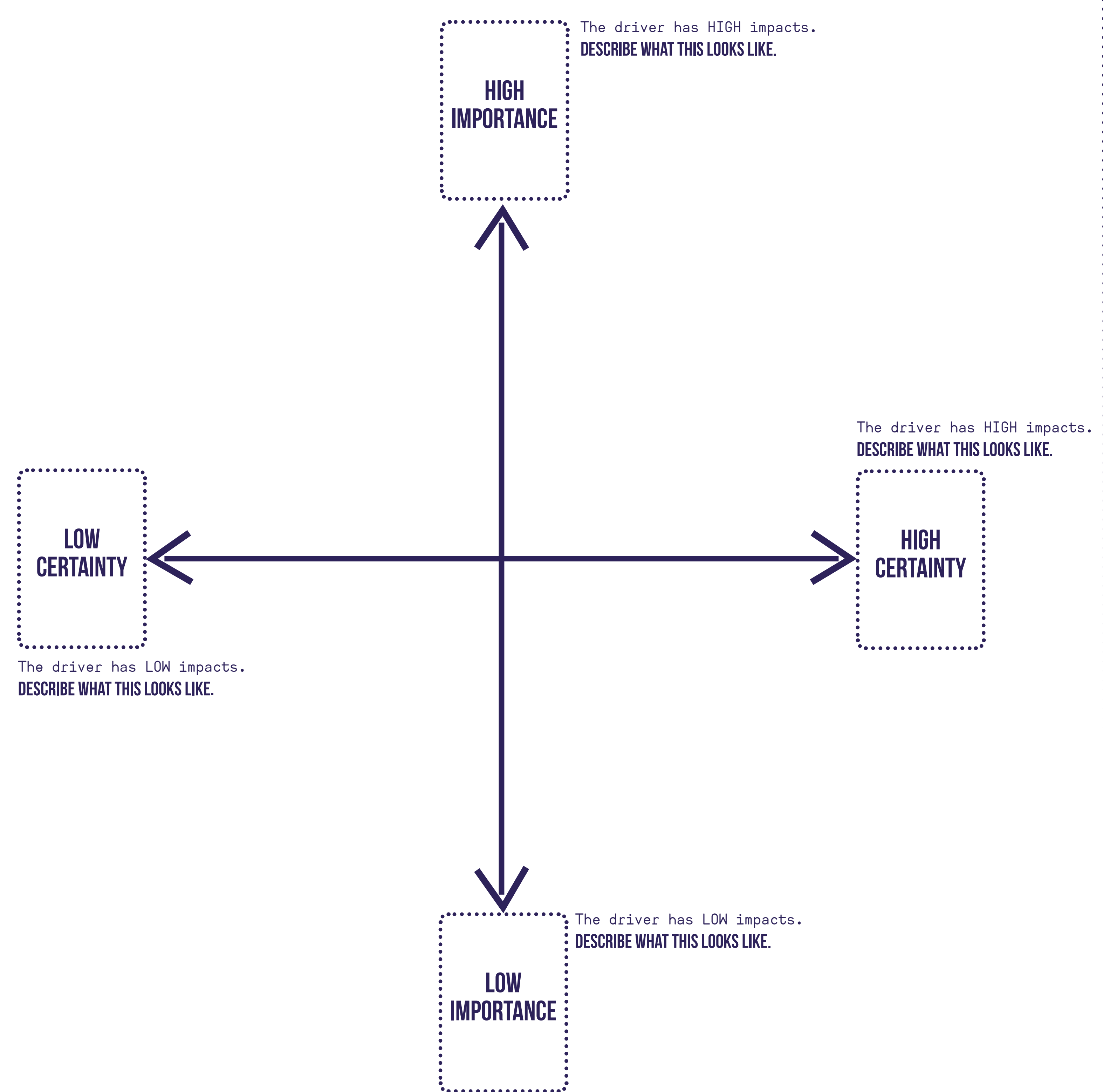

3 PLOTTING YOUR DRIVERS

Now, you need to decide the level of influence your drivers of change have in your world. The following axis will help you visualize the level of influence your driver of change has in your world.

WORLD BUILDER RULES

<p>PLAUSIBLE:</p> <p>The world you imagine needs to be plausible - it must fall within the limits of what might realistically happen. Zombie apocalypse and alien invasions are always fun, but can't be included sadly.</p>	<p>DIFFERENT:</p> <p>Your world should be structurally different, meaning that it should not be just an extension or exacerbation of what we know today. Consider ten years ago, our world did not have Uber, Instagram or self driving cars - and yet they are a reality today.</p>	<p>CONSISTENT:</p> <p>The world you create should have a consistent flow with the drivers of change ruling it. The logic of your world must not contradict what drives change within it.</p>	<p>DECISION-MAKING ORIENTED:</p> <p>Each world as a whole should provide sufficient information to the questions presented below. The more descriptive, the better.</p>	<p>CHALLENGING:</p> <p>The world should challenge our conventional wisdom about the future. It must provoke our current mental models.</p>
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ENRICH YOUR NARRATIVE

Describe a specific region, city, or community within the world (this can also be a figment of your imagination)

Tell the story from a character or group perspective. The character or group could be a citizen, leader, student, scientist, etc. Below are some prompts that can help you build your narrative.
